Tuition hours: The average number of study hours required to complete one level is 176 hrs which are covered primarily in 8-week courses over an academic year, i.e. two levels per semester, although at certain levels these hours are covered in longer (16-week) courses.

Students in streams A and B receive 22 hours of instruction per week throughout the academic year (20 hours on core classes and 2 hours on electives). Students in stream C in the Fall semester receive the same number of weekly instructional hours as students in streams A and B. In the Spring semester, their tuition hours decrease to 12 hours a week with 10 hours on core classes and 2 hours on elective. Students in stream D receive 12 hours of instruction throughout the academic year.
